### What's the difference between tech and dress rehearsals? The

week before recital, dancers will spend time on stage during their regular classes as teachers work with lighting and sound technicians to iron out any technical issues. It is important for dancers to remain attentive and quiet throughout this important process. At dress rehearsal, dancers have the opportunity to run through their pieces, while getting comfortable in costume.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR DRESS REHEARSALS

- Dancers must attend in costume with hair and makeup complete.
- All costume pieces should be labeled in advance with your dancer's name. Avery non-iron fabric stickers, which can be ordered from Amazon, are perfect for this task. If your dancer has multiple classes in one rehearsal or show, please have costumes clearly marked in a costume bag.
- Arrival times are listed.
- Level I and younger dancers must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.
- Apprentices must arrive 15 minutes before their dancers.
- Level II+ dancers must arrive 20 minutes earlier than listed to warm up.
- At the top of the hour, dancers should be seated in the Sanctuary and remain seated until called forward.
- Each class receives 10 minutes on stage. Parents are encouraged to take pictures.
- •Dancers are welcome to go home after being dismissed off the stage.

## SHOWS

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR SHOW DAY

- Check-in times are listed at the right. Please do not arrive earlier than your listed time unless otherwise arranged.
- Level II+ dancers may check in and out on their own through the main studio doors. One guardian per younger dancer must be on hand for check-in (studio doors) and check-out (west wing doors at cafeteria).
- Dancers must arrive stage ready costume, hair, makeup complete.
- Each dancer should bring a water bottle labeled with first and last names.
- Dancers may not eat while in costume, thus we recommend feeding your dancer a protein-rich meal before arriving.
- Doors open 30 minutes before each show for ticketed guests. Any remaining tickets will be available for purchase at that time.
- Dancers will remain backstage with volunteers and staff for the entire show and appear on stage for the final bow.
- Dancers are encouraged to remain in costume for photographs with loved ones.

What's happening behind the scenes for our youngest dancers? After check-in at the front desk, dancers (Level I and younger) are taken to a student room in the west wing, where a group of parent volunteers and staff engage them in play to put them at ease before the exciting moment they are called to line up for their stage time. They enjoy games, puzzles, crafts, coloring, and reading. A non-messy snack is included at some point in the time (such as all-fruit snacks, gluten-free pretzels, apple slices). Before the show begins, hair and makeup assistants make sure dancers are stage ready, providing touch-ups as necessary. Mrs. Amy makes a special visit to pray with the group before the show. At show's end, dancers line up for the final bow.

What about older dancers? Their experience is similar in that they are offered quiet activities, but we find that their time is usually spent warming up, visiting with each other, and changing costumes and hairstyles as many of our older dancers are in multiple classes. Parents and staff are present during each show to monitor and assist dancers. An on-site nurse is available if medical care is needed.

## IMPORTANT INFO

Costumes: Costume try-ons to determine fit will happen in late March through April during regular classes. We are still waiting on a few costumes, thus the spread-out fittings. Watch your WhatsApp class chat for more information on costuming. Please note that we are requiring a student's family account to be brought current by April 1 (all charges before that date paid) to receive recital costumes. If you have any questions about this, please reach out!

**Hair:** Instructions for each class are listed on the "Costume Extras" sheets."


**Makeup:** Because dancers perform under bright stage lighting, their faces can often appear washed out. Our female dancers need makeup to highlight their eyes, cheeks, and lips. We will have high-quality, professional stage makeup kits (minus foundation) available at the studio for purchase in April (limited supplies) for \$44. We love these long-lasting colors, but you may also assemble your own makeup kit.

- **1. Foundation** (skin color) Sponge on heavier than for daily wear and blend at the jawline.
- 2. Blush (pink, no sparkles) Brush onto cheek bones.
- **3. Eyeliner** (brown if blond-haired, black if brown/black-haired) Line upper lid and half of lower lid.
- **4. Eyeshadow** (muted colors, no sparkles) Light color applied to full upper lids, darker to lower half of upper lids.
- **5. Mascara** (black) Apply to upper lashes. Fake eyelashes optional.
- **6. Lipstick** (red to match skin tone)

**Tickets:** Tickets (all reserved seating) for each show sell out quickly, so we recommend that you place your order early. You'll be able to place your order online from our website beginning at 8 a.m. Monday, April 7.

Tickets in the first two rows are \$30. All other seats will be \$15 in advance and \$20 at the door (30 minutes prior to each show if tickets remain). We have handicap seating as well and a ramp into the building from the west side. Please let us know if you need any other assistance.



**Roses:** Honor your dancers with ease by purchasing roses in the lobby at each show. Prices are the same as last year! \$3 for 1, \$5 for 2, \$8 for 3, \$10 for 4, and \$13 for 5.

**Program Ads:** Contact Jaime Sherman if you would like to sponsor one of our shows — Thursday, Friday, or Saturday — or purchase ad space in our recital program. We have a special opportunity for you to honor one or all three of the graduating seniors — Emma Wamsley, Brenna Rogers, or Baylee Baker. Reach out ASAP to be guaranteed a spot in the program, which will be a printed, keepsake version this year!

**Recital Poster:** The photo on this year's recital poster was taken by Katie Felix of Felix Photography and is of one of this year's three seniors, Brenna Rogers. Pick up recital stickers and flyers at the studio to spread the word about our performances.

## COSTUME EXTRAS

Please find your dancer's class(es) to identify and then purchase what your dancer will need to complete his or her recital attire. We recommend ordering dance-specific items early from www.discountdance.com or purchasing locally from Dancer's Closet at 576 Olive St. in Eugene. The store is open most afternoons. Call prior to your visit to make sure they're open — 541.868.1708. If you're making a trip to Portland, we highly recommend The Leotard, 2432 NE Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.

Hair: Middle part, slicked back into a mid ponytail curled or straight (dancer's choice)

Socks (IA): White no-show Socks (IB): Black crew Shoes: White sneakers

#### Hip-Hop III & IV

Hair: Middle part, slicked back into a mid ponytail curled or straight (dancer's choice)

Shoes: White sneakers

Socks: White crew (no skin showing)

Hip Hop & Popping Shoes: Inexpensive shoes can be found on Amazon, Walmart, or other discount sites, but we recommend the low-profile white Weissman Blaze Icon Dance Sneaker, which you can purchase at the studio for \$40 if requested before May 1. Just let us know what size you'll need, and we'll charge your account when we place your order with Weissman.

**Leotards & Tights:** Please note that if your female dancer has a costume change during a show, she is required to wear a skin-colored leotard as her base layer. We usually have leotards on hand at the studio for purchase along with tights, so feel free to check with us before you shop elsewhere. It's always good to have an extra pair on hand in case of a snag during a rehearsal or show.

Nail Polish & Jewelry: Dancers must remove all nail polish for dress rehearsals and shows. Please plan accordingly and save manicures and pedicures for postrecital fun. In addition, jewelry is not permitted for classes, rehearsals, and shows because these accessories are distracting and can be dangerous for dancers as they move.
